Baranduda Land Care encourages Council, developers, landholders, and residents to use Australian native species in landscaping of streets and reserves, farms and residential gardens. Use of these species helps to identify our area, conserve its flora and provide valuable wildlife habitat. In recognition of the range of environmental benefits accrued, Baranduda Land Care has a policy of planting native (mostly indigenous) species in all of its revegetation programs.

#### Trees, Shrubs and Groundcovers for Farms, Roadsides, Parks and Urban Gardens

I Indigenous: native to Baranduda and surrounds  
 # Australian: native to Australia, yet suitable to Baranduda  
 W Winter flowering, esp. beneficial to native birds (honeyeaters)  
 @ Suitable for larger areas  
 % Smaller trees - suitable for urban gardens; esp. dwarf forms  
 \*\* Height <1m
